

The flyer for the herding test on August 12 is on page 12, now isn't that a coincidence...I really didn't plan it that way, honest.





I was starting to stress myself out. The therapist called my name and off we went down the hall into a room which was totally different than an exam room. This room had lots of colorful things like cones, mats, big and small exercise balls. My therapist, Ken, told Amanda to take my leash off. While they talked I checked everything out and even went into another room that had a clear tall box with a door. I went right in and found nothing exciting so I did an about turn and walked out.

Ken had me do some easy stuff like walk over some really low jumps. Just for walking over them I got treats! I also got to stand on some discs and put my front feet up on a peanut. Wasn't actually a peanut but a longish exercise ball. Ken said I was doing great! He said I wasn't afraid to try out the stuff he was making me do. Hey if treats were involved I was loving it. While Ken was typing things in his computer I

came across a basket filled with dog toys! I sure had fun tossing the toy around the room. When he was done he wanted to go into that clear box. I did and when I turned around he closed the door. Then I heard a funny noise and all of a sudden the floor started filling up with water. The water came up to about my elbows. Then the floor started moving so I started walking. I'm not much of a water dog. I don't like playing in paddling pools like Greta did. A run on a beach and lake are different. I'm also pretty quiet and don't bark much unless I have to. I was telling Amanda and Ken that I really didn't like this exercise. I was telling them how I protested it and the whole clinic probably heard me too. But I just kept walking and complaining and before I knew it I was done.

I'm pretty sore after my therapy but I have to say I do feel better for it. Because of the blood clot on my left leg it is taking longer to recover, if it does at all. It's harder for me to walk but much easier for me to run.

My specialist wants me to do some regular swimming. Great, remember I said I don't really like water. I'm more than willing to give anything a try at least once like it or not.

amount of work to go through the AKC calendar and list the shows in Washington, Oregon, and Idaho. The list gives you an opportunity to plan trips around the dates, or just to show which ones you may like to go to as a spectator.

A few months ago I began listing the clubs offering obedience only under **Specialty Obedience Trials** at the end of the conformation listings. Many or most of the conformation shows also have obedience so I don't list them in both lists. Beginning this month I will put 2 asterisks by the obedience only shows whose classes are held indoors.

A hint for those who don't want to spend all day at a show — some breed specialties (like ours) also hold all-breed obedience trials and their entries aren't always as large.

I have a baby gate in the sliding glass door from the kitchen to the back yard. I like fresh air and like to keep the door open with just the screen closed. Wrangler came over to me and started fussing around, "talking" to me and poking my arm with his nose. It dawned on me he had been outside so he must have opened the gate. back in, shut the gate, and went back to working on the newsletter.

Otherwise, they could have attended many meetings, but they still have to be at that particular meeting when they are introduced as an applicant.

Only two more club functions during the rest of this year — The raffle in October and the Christmas party in December.

The auction is lots of fun and the people attending always seem to come up with some great items.



The 48 Star Flag: On July 4,1912, the U.S. flag grew to 48 stars with the addition of New Mexico (January 6th, 1912) and Arizona (February 14, 1912) Executive Order of President Taft dated June 24, 1912 - established the proportions of the flag and provided for arrangement of the stars in six horizontal rows of eight each, a single point of each star to be upward. This flag was official for 47 years, longer than any other flag, through two World Wars and the emergence of the United States of America as the leading nation of the world. Eight Presidents served under this flag; William H. Taft (1909-1913), Woodrow Wilson (1913-1921), Warren Harding (1921-1923), Calvin Coolidge (1923-1929), Herbert Hoover (1929-1933), Franklin D. Roosevelt (1933-1945), Harry S. Truman (1945-1953), Dwight D.

Eisenhower (1953-1961)

Driving Directions to Manhattan Community Hall





From I-5 driving north: Take the Orilla exit, turn left at end of exit, follow <u>S</u> 188th on across Highway 99 and through tunnel

188th on across Highway 99 and through tunnel under the runway; stay on this road, which becomes Des Moines Memorial Drive, until you come to the light at 8th Avenue 5, turn left, then right on South 186th, right on 4th Avenue 5., and right on South 183rd (which is really a gravel driveway at this point), drive to the end to Manhattan Community Hall.

(You are basically making a big circle after you turn onto S. 186th as the hall is at the end of a dead end road.)

From I-5 driving south: Take the Orilla exit, turn right, follow from <u>5.188th</u> above.



8 Things To Pack For a Road Trip With Your Dog

#1 IDENTIFICATION TAG — Before you leave, get your dog microchipped or, if he has one already, update with both the microchip registration service and your vet. Update your dog's tags, too, and ensure collars fit well and have no tears or other damage.

#2 CRATE — Even if you're on the most petfriendly vacation, there may be times when you have to leave your pet in the hotel room. To prevent your dog(s) from dashing out if a maid or other member of the hotel staff opens the door, place them in a crate when you leave the room. Some hotels even have policies that require you to do so.

#3 HARNESS - According to a AAA survey more than half the drivers admit to being

distracted by petting their dogs, and the risk of an accident increases when you take your eyes off the road for two seconds or more. Look for harnesses that have been crash-tested.

#4 vaccination records & extra

MEDS — Book a pre-trip appointment with the vet if your dogs are due for any vaccinations. Stock up on medications, too. Have your vet's office give you your pets' shot records to keep handy.

#5 FIRST-AID KIT — Pack it with bandages and other essentials, such as scissors, bandages, and a thermometer. Also create a list of animal hospitals along your travel route and at your final destination. If any emergency occurs, you won't have to waste time researching.

#6 BOWLS — Have a collapsible bowl for your dog's trips, but feel free to bring your regular bowls or dog-friendly water bottles. You might want to bring your own water to avoid upset tummies, especially if you're going to be out of your area.

#7 EXTRA FOOD — Have plenty of what they're used to. Bring more than what youre used to. If your dog is prone to carsickness, feed him when you arrive at your destination and not before or during travel breaks.

#8 TOYS — Favorite toys are always great to pack. Little comforts of home can make your pet feel more comfortable. Bring your dogs' favorite blanket, also leaving your bathrobe (or some piece of your clothing) on the bed or a chair will make the dog feel more comfortable knowing you will be back. and aren't abandoning him/her.

The Club's Temperament Test was held on Sunday, July 16, at Carco Park, attracting 21 dogs, one of our largest entries for some time (20 of them passed), 15 of which were GSDs, 9 of which belonged to club members (plus 3 Akitas, 2 Aussies, and one GSD/Husky mix). Kerry is to be congratulated for spreading the word so effectively.

This was one of the most efficient tests I've conducted. Kerry and her crew have the registration process down to perfection, including always having the next entrant ready for me as soon as I am through with the previous one. I arrived a little before 9:00 and Kerry's crew had the course all set up with just a little fine tuning from me. The briefing to those entered was held about 9:30, the test began about 10:00, and we were out of there with everything packed away by 12:30 after running the 21 dogs through the test. All this without having to rush the people through the test and answering any questions they had once they had finished it.

After sending a \$105 fee (\$5 per dog) to the parent club (GSDCA), the club took in \$530. I'm not sure what expenses will have to come out of that, but this was truly a huge success.

Thanks also to Kerry for sending in the list of owners and dogs listed on the previous page.


