
May Meeting...Voting on 2019 Specialty Judges. Nominations for GSDCWS Board Positions, (voting for this will be in June).

This is a copy of Aggie's Certificate for The Thirteen Club received recently from the GSDCA. It was even more poignant for me as at the bottom it says "A Mary Roberts Longevity Program". Mary was a good friend who finished two champions for me. I think of her often.

I had written Kerry and asked the names of the dogs in a semi-circle at SKC posing for pictures on page 10 of the last issue. She dutifully sent them to me and I forgot (as usual) to put them in and ran across them again when I had the newsletter all put together and ready to go into the mail. So if you're still interested they were, going left to right: Nickcoal's (black puppy) Lyric, Laura's Faith, Kim's Fortune, Kerry's Rollin, Erika's Luna, and Cindy's Zorro.

According to Martha Stewart's Living magazine, the state of Washington is one of the top recyclers, I assume we were number one since we were first so not in alphabetical order.

I checked out an audio book of Ellery Queen. I was surprised to see on the back of the "book" to learn that Ellery Queen was a pseudonym of two cousins from New York, Frederic Danny and Manfred Lee. Ellery Queen was also the name of their fictional detective. The story was written by the two men as an entry in a best first mystery writing contest. At our match in April we had an entry of 21 from about 15 or 16 dogs in Obedience and Rally judged by Debbie Addicoat, a local rally judge who is working toward her license for obedience. Anyway, only 4 members were entered so it was a good thing so many people with other breeds supported the match. Conformation only had 3 entries.

Using the DVDs, you can train when its convenient for you, no worry about missing a class and getting behind. You can watch a segment over several times until you're sure you understand it before working with your dog. You can also call me if you have any questions. Once your dog knows the exercises, you can take him/her out to work in public to

The rules were updated May 1 and go into effect in June and/or July, depending on your circumstances.

It's nice to see the lawmakers cracking down on the "fake" service dogs people are taking into the stores. Some of the airlines are going along with this...I couldn't believe the variety of animals people take on transportation as service animals. I mean, chickens?, snakes? goats? If someone sat next to me with a "service snake", they'd have to call the medics for me. No thank you!

This month we celebrate Mother's Day. Believe it or not I've had women tell me at our specialties that coming to our shows is a Mother's Day present from their families. Now, isn't that thoughtful to give mother a day off from working around the house and let her spend the day doing "her" stuff? I know my kids long ago figured out I would be at our show on Mother's Day and always arrange lunch on some other day. Who says kids are too old to learn when they're in their 30s or even 50s? Hot Diggity Dog! If you check out the new conformation point schedule (effective May 1) listed on page 21, you'll see they lowered a few of the numbers. So with our larger conformation entries this year, there will be major points won in dogs and bitches unless absentees change the numbers shown.

In the first show Saturday morning, there are 12 dogs entered which will be a 5-point major if there are no absentees; there are 10 bitches entered for a 4-point major if there are no absentees.

For the 2nd show on Saturday afternoon, there are 9 dogs entered for a 4-point major if there are no absentees; in bitches there are 6 for a 3-point major if there are no absentees.

For the 3rd show (Sunday AM), there 10 dogs entered for a 4-point major and 8 bitches for a 4-point major.

So now the conformation people have to hope everyone who entered also shows up. In some of the cases, they may be dropped by one point which will still be a major.

**From I-5 driving north:** Take the Orilla exit, turn left at end of exit, follow <u>S 188th</u> on across Highway 99 and through tunnel under the runway; stay on this road, which becomes Des Moines Memorial Drive, until you come to the light at 8th Avenue S, turn left, then right on South 186th, right on 4th Avenue S., and right on South 183rd (which is really a gravel driveway at this point), drive to the end to Manhattan Community Hall.





### New Championship Points

Annually AKC looks at how many points people will win at dog shows (going Winners Dog or Winners Bitch) and the new numbers are effective each May 1.

The new schedule for German Shepherds is:

1 pt	2 pts	3 pts	4 pts	<u>5 pts</u>
•	•	•	•	•
2/2	4/5	6/9	7/10	12/13

The first number in each category is for dogs, the second number is for dogs. So to win a 5-point major in bitches, there would need to be at least 13 bitches entered in the bitch classes. For the dog, there would need to be 12 dogs entered in the dog classes.

So if the bitch (or dog) were to go Best of Winners over the Winners Dog (or Winners Bitch), she/he would then be entitled to the same number of points the bitch (or dog) had earned.

Then, if the bitch went on to Best of Breed, any bitches she beat in the Specials class would also count toward points.



# Entering and Exiting the Ring by Diane Schultz

It has been a longstanding policy that dogs remain under control when entering and exiting the ring. The area of the ring gate, where a team enters and exits the ring, is busy, with people and dogs routinely coming and going. Leaving the ring with a dog under control is not only a display of good sportsmanship but promotes a safer environment for all.

Prior to May 1, 2018, lack of control when exiting the ring often went unnoticed by judges and was not properly penalized under Miscellaneous Penalties.

The additional language that requires a judge to be in position to see the team exit the ring, and to penalize the dog that does not remain under control when they enter and exit the ring, is expected to improve ring safety. It is in no way intended to prevent a team from celebrating joyfully inside the ring between exercises or after the last exercise. The celebration, with the dog remaining under the handler's control, may include and is not limited to jumping for joy, hand touching, spinning, and tugging on the leash inside the ring; however, the dog must exit the ring gate under control and without jumping, tugging, or pulling.


