

Some didn't seem to be too serious about it (they didn't submit a picture of any text on why they would be a good governor), but even if you take them out, there are still a heck of a lot of candidates! Well, don't forget to send in your ballot, the deadline is August 4 (hopefully you'll have the NSN by then).

Have you filled out your census questionnaire and sent it back? Seems like they have been reminding people to do so on tv for quite a while, I thought the deadline was a long ago, do they just extend the deadline because they don't think enough have been returned? Geez, they should have brought them down to Seattle during the protests and filled them out down there. That would have been several thousand anyway.

Dog shows are being cancelled right and left. AKC had their conformation contest with people sending in videos of their dogs gaiting and being stacked and then had a judge or judges pick the winner. I remember how excited some people were who had a big win at a dog show...what can they do winning in a "virtual" show? Run down their neighborhood yelling, "I won, I won?"

Some tips for heeling: **Corrections for Forging**. (1) You can turn left into the dog when it is barely ahead of you, raising you right knee as you turn so it bumps the dog (do not push the dog with your knee). (

2) Keep both hands (holding the leash) at your waist, take one quick step backwards, then immediately continue walking forward. The step backward, will jerk the dog back a little, the immediate step forward then puts slack back in the leash.

The dog won't see you jerk him back because you didn't jerk him with your hands, you've just become erratic the way you walk. Most people don't give good jerks anyway, they just end up pulling the dog. (

3) Before the leash is tightened as he goes out ahead of you, with both hands against your mid section again make a sharp about turn and go the other way. Doing these three things will make him watch you and adjust to you. Your dog may think you're a little bonkers, but will still love you, because you are NOT jerking him directly with these corrections, just changing directions.

Corrections for Lagging: (1) Let your leash hang down in front of your left leg just below your knee and walk normally. Then every time you take a step on your left foot it will give the dog a little jerk, but because you continue walking, that leg will immediately go back and the leash is loose again.

(2) While walking forward, take a running jump step on the left leg, then continue walking. The jump step will give the dog a jerk, but then lands and the leash loosens up again. Do not pull the dog up to you. Pulls they can pull back on and you just end up with a tug of war. These kind of jerks they can't pull back on because they don't know when they are coming and the leash is only tight for a fraction. Most people aren't adept at giving a short sharp jerk like this, so let your body do the work.

My thanks to Patricia Knight who recommended her vet to me. My vet is afraid of Wrangler and the assistant had what could have been called a headlock on him except I was holding his head and she had her arms around his mid section. He wasn't very happy being manhandled like that and he let out a low growl, no curled lips or showing of teeth.

Patricia told me about Nicole Deal who is a vet at Renton Vet so I took him there for his annual physical this year. I was a little apprehensive since he had never been there before and didn't know them...and with the Coronavirus they weren't letting you go in the building even...they come out to your car and take the dog in, then bring him back to you when he's through. I just didn't want him to have a bad experience since he goes in annually.

My worries were all for naught as he came out to the parking lot when they were through wagging his tail and Nicole had nothing but nice things to say about him. I guess I was just being a nervous Nelly, but I have never given him over to a stranger who took him away. He's used to me handing the leash to someone else while I did something else, but never have them take him away.

Our Temperament Test was a success on July 19 with 21 entries, but 2 didn't show up. Out of the 19 who went through the test, 18 passed and 1 failed. Kerry gave each one who passed a sheet she printed out they could send to AKC (along with \$25 of course) and AKC would put the title on your dog's records.

A list of dogs passing and pictures of the helpers are on pages 9 and 10.

Have a good summer — since it seems to have finally arrived in the Great Pacific Northwest! Hopefully, we'll be able to have a meeting in September!

New posts on AKC Obedience & Rally Judges

Title Requirements Amended

by AKC Companion Events Department

Titling Requirements Temporarily Amended – Obedience/ Rally/Agility

July 16, 2020

To All Clubs Licensed for Obedience, Rally and Agility:

To better assist clubs and exhibitors during this unusual time in our sports, the Obedience, Rally and Agility departments received approval by the AKC Board of Directors to change the number of judges required for awarding some titles in obedience, rally and agility. Due to the travel restrictions and other local regulations impacting the country from COVID-19, many clubs are struggling to bring in judges from outside their area, plus exhibitors are looking to stay close to home.

This change will eliminate the requirement that two different judges are required for the titles shown below that require three qualifying scores (legs) to earn the titles. The change is effective retroactively to July 1, 2020 and will be in effect through December 31, 2020. The Regulations suspension will be revisited at the end of the year.

For all of the titles listed at the bottom of this announcement exhibitors may earn three qualifying scores (legs) under the same judge through December 31, 2020.

Due to Covid-19, and effective immediately, two additional policy/regulation amendments have been added to the "Obedience/Rally Best Practices."

- The regulation that no exhibitor may show a dog under a judge at an obedience or rally trial if the exhibitor has participated in a training session taught by that judge within thirty (30) days prior to the date of the event, is waived through December 30, 2020.
- 2. The regulation that no dog may be entered/ shown under a judge at an obedience/rally trial if the dog is owned/handled by any person who has regularly served as a trainer/instructor of that judge, or if the dog has been regularly trained or instructed by the judge within thirty (30) days prior to the date of the trial, is waived until December 30, 2020.

THE ART OF SAMPLE COLLECTION



Collecting samples that will produce quality results is as easy as connecting the dots!

When it comes to sample fails, we dislike them just as much as you do! We don't like knowing that the turn-around time will be extended for our clients and we definitely don't like seeing you disconcerted.

Why Do Samples Fail?

There are 2 main causes of sample failure, wet swabs or not enough DNA collected. Moisture is what causes the *true villain* to appear- *bacteria*.

DNA Quality - Sealing up swabs before they have had the time to dry creates the perfect environment for bacteria to breed and there's nothing better than DNA for bacteria to feed on. These bacteria then produce certain enzymes that quickly **degrade** the DNA on the swab.

DNA Quantity - The amount of epithelial cells (cells that line the inside of the cheek) collected is also very important. If there are not enough cells present on the swab it can make extraction very difficult to impossible.

The Art of Collection

For proper sample collection please be sure to do the following:



- Insert head against the inside of the cheek.
- Pinch the cheek around the bristle heads firmly and roll the 2 swabs around the pinched area.
- Swirl in a circular motion for 10-20 seconds.



- Stand swabs up in a cup or other holder with the bristle head up.
- Allow swabs to dry for 5-10 minutes.



 Avoid moisture being trapped in the swab sleeve before sealing.

Zev served the community of Renton with distinction since 2015 alongside his partner, Officer Adam. Known as an excellent tracker, Zev had great success in locating both people and evidence. Zev was also well-known for his many community appearances. He was a sevenyear-old German shepherd from Germany.

Renton K-9

The Patrol K-9 Unit started in 1979 with a single tracking dog. Since then, 14 K-9 teams have served the City of Renton. Currently there are three generalist K-9 teams: Titan, Zev, and Odin. These teams are assigned to different shifts in the Patrol Operations Division so that their acute senses can be utilized to assist at crime scenes.

The safety of the public and other police officers is the primary concern of the members of the K-9 Unit. The dogs have a keen sense of smell, eyesight, and hearing, that allows them to locate hiding suspects easier, safer, and usually much quicker than officers searching by themselves.

The dogs are used to search open areas, buildings, and commercial yards for suspects. The psychological effect of having a dog present in a tense situation proves beneficial to all. Countless times the dog's presence has de-escalated violent scenes without the use of physical force. They also serve as ambassadors for the department, attending public events and demonstrations.

Each handler takes their police car and dog home each day. The k


