





President's report:

The board will be working month to month on determining club meetings. Hoping we can get together starting off the new year of 2021.

1st Vice President's report:

Specialty show: overall, our shows went well. Had a couple of complaints on the location. One had to do with the obedience ring and having mushrooms in it the first day, they were removed for the second day. The person was concerned the dogs may eat the mushrooms. The check-in table to get your number was a success. The 3 clubs are splitting the cost of the facility and porta potty costs with income from RV parking and catalog sales going to our club. There was a profit of \$450 so each club will be mailed a check for \$150. Trophy funds was \$340, spent \$80 have \$260 left that can be applied to 2021 show. Ribbons cost \$446.94 had a donation of \$34 spent \$412.94. Judges expenses where \$924.88. <u>A Total profit of \$993.03 was made</u> from the show for the club.





Please be advised there is a 1-month waiting period after your introduction at a meeting before applications are reviewed and voted on. A condition of membership is to have an "active" status in the club, which means attending at least two club meetings, or special functions, supporting club events, or by donations to or working at them.

Membership dues are (\$35 single - \$50 household) payable to the German Shepherd Dog Club of Wash. State, Inc. (Dues will be refunded if membership process is not completed within 6 months of receipt of check.)

German Shepherd Dog Club of America, Inc. Application for Membership or Renewal

There are two types of membership. **Regular Members**: Minimum age of 18 years. Must be in good standing with AKC. Applicant (and renewing members) agrees to abide by the GSDCA by-laws and the Rules and Regulations of the American Kennel Club. Two endorsements by current members must be provided by new applicants. Applicants name will be published in the *German Shepherd Dog Review*. Provided no objections have been filed within 30 days of publication in the *Review*, applicant will be notified that he/she is eligible for all privileges including the right to vote. **Junior Members**: Must be 10 years of age and not more than 18 years of age and shall subscribe to the same criteria as Regular Membership with the exception of the requirement to pay dues. Junior members cannot vote, hold office, or serve on committees other than junior committees.
